Thank you. My name is Eddy Perez and I am speaking on behalf of Climate Action Network. We are thankful to all Parties that call for our inclusion in workshops and other discussions.

The exchange of views under SBSTA item 11 allows for significant advances at COP 23 to build trust under Article 9 of the Paris Agreement. This accounting system should provide sufficient information on committed funds on an activity level, account for the climate-specific proportion of funds, record non-grant commitments on a grant-equivalents basis, and build on a mutually agreed system between donor and recipient countries on the climate-specific proportion of committed funds.

CAN is encouraged by exchanges in relation to the indigenous peoples platform and we look forward to its operationalisation in November.

On agriculture, we expect Parties to make real progress at COP 23, including on a joint SBSTA/SBI work programme on agriculture and food security.

We look to the Fiji Presidency to increase the Paris momentum, to promote justice, inclusion and participation of all stakeholders and to open up spaces for discussions on adaptation and loss and damage.
